Captain John Clayton Hill, 11, is a class of 1942 graduate of the Naval Academy. He served aboard the battleship USS SOUTH DAKOTA throughout World War II until December 1946. During this tour of duty he was awarded the Bronze Star Medal with Combat "V" for his meritorious achievement as Main Battery Plotting Room Officer.

Subsequent assignments included Aide and Flag Secretary to the Commander Naval Operating Base, Guantanamo Bay; Navigator aboard the USS ROANOKE; Assistant to Director of Naval Reserves at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania; Executive Officer of the USS BORIE; Commanding Officer of the USS PARLE; Head of Navigation Section in the Department of Seamanship and Navigation at the Naval Academy; Staff of Commander in Chief US Atlantic Fleet; Commanding Officer USS MULLINIX; Office of Chief of Naval Operations; Commander Destroyer Division 112. Captain Hill relieved Captain Carl R. Dwyer as Commander of Destroyer Squadron Twenty-Three on 15 December 1964.

KYES HISTORY

USS JAMES E. KYES, built by Todd pacific Shipyard of Seattle, Washington, launched there on 4 August 1945, commissioned on 8 February 1946, was named for Commander James Ellsworth Kyes, USN, who received the Navy Cross with the following citation:

"For extraordinary heroism as Commanding Officer of the USS LEARY during action against a concentrated force of hostile enemy submarines in the North Atlantic. As Commander Kyes boldy maneuvered to close range on four of the hostile pack, the enemy struck, mortally wounding the LEARY with three torpedo hits and causing her to start sinking rapidly. After giving the order to abandon ship, Commander Kyes cooly and courageously made a personal inspection in order to assure himself that none of his men remained aboard. Preparing to abandon ship and observing one of his crew whose life jacket was torn and useless, Commander KYES gallantly removed his own, gave it to the man and calmly went over the side. His heroic conduct and fearless spirit of self-sacrifice in a time of grave peril were in keeping with the highest traditions of the United States Naval Service."

During her third West-Pac cruise the Korean "Police Action" broke out and the ship was immediately ordered to Korean waters where she operated with Task Force 77.

Further deployments to Korean waters during the conflict had the KYES operating with fast carrier task forces, anti-submarine forces, and blockading the coast of Korea.

After the cease fire in Korea, the Kyes returned to Long Beach, her home port since August, 1952.

On April 16, 1962, the KYES assumed an "In commission on reserve" status and commenced a Mark I Fram. The appearance of the ship, from the main deck up, was completely altered. She was outfitted with ASROC (Anti-Submarine Rocket) and DASH (Drone Anti-Submarine Helicopter) thus giving her long range ASW capability. She completed Fram on 18 January 1963.

On 28 April 1963, the KYES became the flagship of the renowned DESRON 23, "The Little Beavers." Thus the KYES made her 13th West-Pac Cruise.

This cruise, the 14th voyage across the "Realm of the Golden Dragon," and into the magic land of the Far East is our subject of this cruise book.



Commanding Officer
CDR R. FRIEDMAN

Captain Robert Friedman, USN, was born in Paso Robles, California, on 8 February 1921. He enlisted in the U.S. Navy as an apprentice seaman on 22 July 1941 and served as an Aviation Machinist's Mate with Scouting Squadron 5 in the South Pacific until he entered Navy flight training in May of 1943. Upon graduation from flight training in September of 1944, he was designated an Aviation Pilot. He was commissioned an Ensign, U.S. Navy, on 5 September 1945.

Captain Friedman served in various squadron until his attendance at the General Line School, Monterey, California. Upon completion of this school, he served in Fleet assignments as Communications Officer, USS ROCHESTER (CA-124); Operations Officer, USS YARNALL(DD-541); Executive Officer, USS FRANK KNOX (DDR-742); and Commanding Officer, USS FALGOUT (DER-324). His assignments ashore have been as Navy Staff Communications Officer, Joint U.S. Military Group, Spain and Executive Officer, U.S. Naval Communication station, Puerto Rico from which duty he reported to USS JAMES E. KYES (DD-787).

BANGKOK THAILAND


